CALL FOR APPLICATIONS
Award of Scholarships by the Government of the Republic of Mauritius

The Government of Mauritius offers to award scholarships to deserving students who are resident citizens of member states of the African Union or African Commonwealth countries, as per the following criteria:

1. For undergraduate programmes, applicants should be above 18 years of age and should not have reached their 26th birthday by 01 January 2026.
2. For MPhil, MPhil/PhD and PhD programmes, applicants should not have reached 40 years by 01 January 2026.
3. Applicants must have already applied for a full-time on-campus programme (Diploma, Degree, MPhil or PhD) at a public Higher Education Institution in Mauritius (listed in **Section 8** in the relevant *Guidelines for Applicants*) for the academic year starting in 2024.
4. The scholarship will be for a maximum duration as indicated in the table below or the minimum course duration **whichever is lesser**.

SN	Programme of Studies	Maximum Duration
1	Undergraduate Diploma	Three (3) years
2	Undergraduate Degree	Four (4) years
3	MPhil	Two (2) years + 6 months for thesis defence
4	MPhil / PhD	Four (4) years + 6 months for thesis defence
5	PhD	Three (3) years + 6 months for thesis defence

The Scholarship will support successful candidates in meeting their tuition fees and contributing to their living expenses during their studies in Mauritius. Furthermore, the scholarship covers return airfare by the most economical route. This will be valid for travel from the country of origin at the beginning of the studies and back to the country of origin upon successful completion of studies.

I. Guidelines for Applicants

- Scholarship applications can only be made on the application form.
 - An application under this scheme is to be made solely through the nominating agency responsible for processing scholarships in the applicant's country of citizenship.
 - **Section 5** of the application form should be endorsed and completed by the Nominating Agency in the applicant's country of citizenship.
 - Such Nominating Agency, which may typically be part of the Ministry of Education in the country of the applicant, will then shortlist and endorse the applications of a maximum of **FIFTEEN (15)** eligible candidates (the decision on the distribution of nominees from the undergraduate and/or postgraduate programmes rest on the nominating agencies) and submit the duly completed application forms as per the table below:

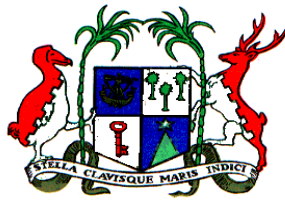

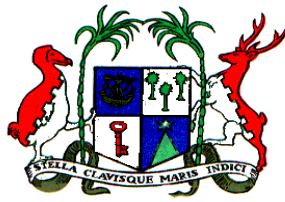

GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS

Diploma and Undergraduate degree

Introduction

The Government of the Republic of Mauritius is offering scholarships to deserving students who are resident citizens of member states of the African Union or African Commonwealth countries for full-time, on-campus **undergraduate** (diploma/degree) programmes tenable in public Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Mauritius.

1. Eligibility Criteria

1.1 Nationality

Candidates must be resident citizens of member states of the African Union or African Commonwealth countries. Mauritian nationals are NOT eligible to apply under this Scheme.

1.2 Age Limit

1.2.1 Applicants should be above 18 years of age and should not have reached their 26th birthday by 01 January 2026

1.3 Required Qualifications

1.3.1 Qualification requirements to be eligible for Diploma Programme

Candidates must have:

Either

(i). A minimum of five (5) credits at School Certificate (S.C), or General Certificate of Education (G.C.E) 'O' Level or International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), inclusive of a credit in English Language or acceptable evidence of proficiency in English Language (as per para 1.3.3 below).

Or

(ii). Five (5) 'O' Level passes awarded by any other approved examination body deemed to be equivalent to (i) above, inclusive of a pass in English Language or acceptable evidence of proficiency in English Language (as per para 1.3.3 below).

Or

(iii) Qualification equivalent to (i) above.

Note:

- (a) A pass in English at A-level will be acceptable in lieu of English Language at 'O' Level.
- (b) A pass at subsidiary level and/or 'A' Level or equivalent will be acceptable in lieu of a pass at 'O' Level as per (i) and (ii) above.
- (c) Some diploma programmes may have higher qualification requirements than those mentioned above and applications will be considered only for candidates meeting the minimum requirements of these programmes.
- (d) Candidates already holding a diploma will not be considered.
- (e) For those coming from a French speaking country at least an overall average of 60% or an overall average of 12/20;

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1.3.2 Qualification requirements to be eligible for Undergraduate degree Programme:

Candidates should have successfully completed end-of-secondary schooling and should satisfy the minimum grade requirements as indicated below:

- (i) at least 21 points at GCE or HSC A-Level which will be computed on the basis of the following grades obtained in three Principal subjects: A+=10, A=9, B=8, C=7 & D=6; **OR**
- (ii) at least an overall average of 60% or an overall average of 12/20; **OR**
- (iii) qualification equivalent to (i) or (ii) above.

Note:

Candidates already holding an undergraduate degree will not be considered

1.3.3 In case the language of instruction in the qualifying examination is not English, the candidate will have to provide a valid TOEFL test result with a minimum score of 550 (paper based) or 213 (computer based) or 79 (internet based) or valid IELTS test results with a minimum score of 5.5 or an acceptable proof of English Language proficiency. Selected candidates will be requested to have a verbal interaction virtually prior to the award of the scholarship.

1.3.4 Self-financing African students already studying in Mauritius will **NOT** be eligible to apply for the same programme level under this Scholarship Scheme.

1.3.5 Scholarships will NOT be awarded for:

- Top-up degree programmes;
- Foundation programmes;
- Part-time courses; or
- Distance Education programmes;
- Mixed/ Blended modes (Distance Learning and on campus learning)

2. Application Procedure

2.1 The Application Form

The application form can be obtained from the websites below and must be filled in electronically, printed and then signed:

2.2 Application to Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)

2.2.1 All applicants must have already applied for at least one full-time on-campus programme at a public HEI of their choice (listed under **Section 8**). This application must be made as soon as the HEIs have opened their application windows on their respective websites.

An applicant may either:

- (a) obtain a **conditional offer** (*letter of admission*) from their chosen Mauritian public HEI and submit this along with the scholarship application: **OR**
- (b) An applicant must **submit a receipt of payment of the application fee** from their chosen Mauritian public HEI along with the scholarship application.

Note: The application fee shall be refunded to successful applicants



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- 2.2.2 Applicants must submit the completed **Mauritius-Africa Scholarship Application Form** and all documents as per the Checklist (**Section 7**) to their respective Nominating Agencies. This should be done by a deadline to be determined by the Nominating Agency and communicated to prospective applicants.
- 2.2.3 Candidates must also submit the fully completed **Application Form** and **certified copies** of the following documents as part of their application to their local Nominating Agency:
- (i) Birth Certificate;
 - (ii) Relevant educational certificates and transcripts. Applicants must produce original certificates to the Ministry within two weeks of their arrival in Mauritius.
 - (iii) Medical certificate to be filled and stamped by a registered medical practitioner in **Section 6** of the Application Form; and
 - (iv) Copy of passport biodata page (*if available*).

Note:

- 1) The Mauritian authorities will check the authenticity of all educational certificates, and applicants must produce original certificates upon arrival in Mauritius.
- 2) Non-submission of the documents mentioned above or incorrect or incomplete filling of the application form **will** result in disqualification of the applicant;
- 3) The applicant must sign the Declaration in **Section 4** of the Application Form;
- 4) Certified copies of academic certificates and transcripts, if not in French or English, must be submitted along with a certified translation in one of these two languages;
- 5) In **Section 3** of the Application Form, applicants should indicate the title of their proposed research and the institution(s) where they have secured a seat or for which they have applied for enrolment and
- 6) All applications must be made **exclusively** through the Nominating Agency in the applicant's country of citizenship, along with the necessary supporting documents.

2.3 Application Enquiries

Applicants are advised to contact the Nominating Agency in their country of citizenship, or in the absence thereof, the respective Ministry of Education, to obtain details on the application procedure to be followed when submitting applications.

3. Shortlisting by the Nominating Agency and Evaluation Process

- 3.1 Applications for the Scholarships are to be made to the Nominating Agency in the applicant's country of origin and are **NOT** to be sent directly to Mauritius by the applicant. The Nominating Agency, typically part of the Ministry of Education, will shortlist and nominate candidates for diploma and degree programmes (indicating the level of studies for each nominated candidate). The Nominating Agency of the country of citizenship of the candidates, or the Ministry of Education, will subsequently transmit the application forms to Mauritius.
- 3.2 Applications from candidates who do not have the endorsement of their Nominating Agencies, or in the absence thereof, that of the Ministry of Education, will **NOT** be considered.



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- 3.3 Candidates who have not been informed of their selection for the award of a scholarship within six months of the MASS application deadline should consider that they have not been selected. We **do not encourage** individual queries.
- 3.4 Selection of candidates for the Scholarship will be based on merit.
- 3.5 The list of successful applicants for each Member State will be communicated to their respective Nominating Agencies, and a communiqué will be placed on the Mauritian Ministry of Education's website once the selection exercise has been completed. The Mauritian Ministry of Education will, in parallel, issue the successful applicants with a Scholarship Agreement Form, which is to be signed and submitted to the Mauritian Ministry of Education upon appointment **within two (2) weeks** of their arrival in Mauritius, along with the original of all qualifications submitted. The process of verifying the authenticity of qualifications will be initiated at this point. If found not authentic, the scholarship will be terminated immediately.
- 3.6 The final decision to award a scholarship rests with the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology. This decision shall be final and binding. **The Mauritian Ministry of Education reserves the right not to respond to queries regarding the scholarship process.**

4. Financial Conditions of the Scholarship

4.1 Tuition fees and course-related costs

- 4.1.1 This scholarship provides for an annual payment of fees and other studies-related costs (e.g. general/annual fees and miscellaneous fees, etc) as per the grid below:

(as at 30 September 2024, 1 USD = MUR 45.93)

- 4.1.2 Awardees will **NOT** be allowed to transfer to another HEI or shift course of study once granted a Scholarship.
- 4.1.3 Education fees and other studies-related costs over the amounts mentioned above shall be borne by the awardee.
- 4.1.4 The student will have to bear All costs associated with any examination re-sit or repeat of any academic year.
- 4.1.5 The scholarship will be for a maximum duration as indicated in the table below or the minimum course duration, whichever is lesser.

- 4.1.6 No request for an extension of scholarship will be entertained. The applicant will have to bear the cost of any expenses incurred beyond the time frames mentioned above.
- 4.1.7 No request for additional grants will be entertained.



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4.1.8 Any costs pertaining to fieldwork overseas or the purchase of books will have to be borne by the student.

4.2 Living allowance

4.2.1 Awardees are expected to come to Mauritius with sufficient funds (at least USD 1000) to meet expenses during the initial phase of their stay (about three (3) months) while formalities are being completed locally.

4.2.2 A monthly living allowance of **MUR 16,500** will be paid to awardees as part support to meet their living expenses. Students are expected to supplement this amount to cover the cost of living in Mauritius. This allowance will be credited to the awardee's bank account in Mauritius monthly, subject to the submission of evidence of satisfactory progress and attendance in the study programme by the HEI.

4.2.3 The payment of allowances during the final year of enrolment in the study programme will cover, on a pro-rata basis, a period of four (4) weeks following the last day of examinations.

4.2.4 An awardee should inform the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology in writing at least **two (2) weeks in advance** if he/she has to leave Mauritius for any reason. Awardees are advised to read the "**Guidelines for MASS awardees travelling abroad**" in case they intend to travel during their scholarship period.

4.3 Other conditions

The awardees should:

- i. abide by the latest government regulations regarding public health;
- ii. abide by the protocols set up by Mauritian authorities for passengers travelling to Mauritius;
- iii. be available to commence their academic studies in Mauritius as per the regulations of the respective institution to which they have been enrolled;
- iv. not be in receipt of or not have received a scholarship from any other public source in Mauritius (including from Higher Education Commission, Mauritius Research and Innovation Council, Higher Education Institutions, etc.); and
- v. not later than one month after arrival in Mauritius, to undergo a medical check-up as per the Passport and Immigration Office requirements (<http://passport.govmu.org>) in any public hospital in Mauritius, and the test results shall be submitted to the Passport and Immigration Office, with a copy to the Ministry.

Note: The Mauritian Ministry of Education reserves the right to request an applicant undergo any other medical tests as it deems fit.

5. Travel to and from Mauritius

5.1 Student Visa and Travel Documents

5.1.1 Prior to an awardee's arrival in Mauritius, the HEI, where the student has secured a seat, will apply for a student visa with the Passport and Immigration Office (PIO) in Mauritius.

5.1.2 For visa application procedures, the awardee must liaise with the HEI where s/he has secured a place.



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- 5.1.3 The PIO will process the student visa application and issue a provisional entry permit valid for three (3) months to enable the student to travel to Mauritius.
- 5.1.4 Issuing a provisional entry permit and student visa is subject to the immigration laws and policies prevailing in Mauritius.
- 5.1.5 The awardee must ensure that s/he holds a **provisional entry permit issued by the PIO before travelling to Mauritius**
- 5.1.6 Students must have a passport valid for the whole duration of the course enrolled.
- 5.1.7 The scholarship also covers a return airfare by the most economical route. This will be valid for travel from the country of origin at the beginning of the studies and back to the country of origin upon successful completion.
- 5.1.8 Awardees must make their own arrangements to pay for their one-way air tickets and then apply for a refund upon arrival in Mauritius by providing the necessary original receipts issued in their name and documentation. Those awardees travelling from countries that require a return ticket as a condition of their exit immigration at the point of departure will have to make arrangements for the same at their own cost.
The cost of the cancellation penalty fees of this return ticket will be refunded to the awardee by the authorities in Mauritius.
- Note: Reimbursement of air ticket cost.
- The authorities in Mauritius will refund airfare from the awardee's country to Mauritius by the most economical route.
- 5.1.9 Students should inform in writing the HEI to which they have been admitted of their travel schedule well in advance.
- 5.1.10 Students who choose to have their family members, relatives, or friends join them for visits to Mauritius will be fully responsible for their airfare, living expenses and any other related expenses.
- 5.1.11 If a HEI terminates a student's enrolment or if a student decides to return to his/her country of citizenship before the completion of the course, the awardee will NOT be entitled to a return ticket. This cost will have to be borne by the awardee.
- 5.1.12 The student will not be entitled to a refund of any expenses related to their travel during vacation time.
- 5.1.13 The awardee will sign an undertaking to leave Mauritius as soon as their programme of study ends.

5.2 Health and Travel Insurances

Beneficiaries are entitled to free health care in public hospitals in Mauritius. The awardees will have to make arrangements for health and travel insurance.



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5.3 Accommodation

Awardees will have to make prior arrangements with the HEI in Mauritius regarding available accommodation facilities.

6. Other conditions of the Scholarship

6.1 Submission of Progress Reports

The HEI will submit quarterly attendance and progress reports for the continuation of scholarship disbursements. These reports will be submitted to the Higher Education Commission and copied to the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology.

6.2 Renewal of Scholarship

6.2.1 Scholarships will be renewable yearly, subject to the successful completion of the previous year of study and subsequent enrolment into the following year.

6.2.2 The Government of Mauritius will discontinue scholarship disbursements if the student is not promoted to the next academic year. Scholarship disbursement will only be resumed upon submission of documents certifying that the awardee has cleared any academic backlog and is enrolled in the following academic year.

6.3 Termination of scholarship

The scholarship may be terminated for unsatisfactory conduct, submission of fake documents, poor progress or attendance, breach of the HEI Rules and Regulations or any breach of the Mauritian laws. The awardee will have to leave the country within two weeks of termination.

If a student is declared medically unfit by a government-approved medical practitioner, the Government of Mauritius reserves the right to cause the studies to be interrupted, subject to the regulations in force in the HEI, and send the student back to the country of origin. All expenses under MASS will be suspended and resume once the student returns to Mauritius.

Guidelines for MPhil/ PhD Supervisors of MASS Awardees

1. Purpose

The purpose of this document is to guide MPhil/ PhD prospective supervisors of MASS applicants and subsequent to an award, supervisors of MASS awardees on their roles and responsibilities to understanding the intricacies of the MASS processes and procedures. These guidelines are to be read and applied alongside the guidelines for supervisors from the different Higher Education Institutions.

2. Scope and Applicability

These guidelines are applicable to all supervisors of international students benefitting from MASS.

3. Duties and Responsibilities of prospective supervisors towards MASS applicants

Once you have accepted to be a potential supervisor, the doctoral school of your institution should be notified.

Supervisors should familiarize themselves with the “**MASS guidelines for MPhil/ PhD applicants**” including timelines and submission requirements.

Supervisors will be required to provide timely academic guidance to MASS applicants in preparing an appropriate research proposal.

Supervisors are requested to refer applicants to your university instances to complete a formal application.

4. Supervisory Roles and Responsibilities

Once an award letter is issued by the Ministry to a candidate:

- (i) Supervisors will guide the students as per the provisions in force at their HEI.
- (ii) In case of any changes to the supervisory teams, the HEC and the Ministry should be informed accordingly by the HEI.
- (iii) Supervisors should regularly meet with MASS awardees to review progress and provide constructive feedback. Supervisors will be required to submit regular progress reports to the HEC through the HEIs.
- (iv) Issues with awardees' academic progress and strategies for overcoming obstacles should be designed and communicated to the HEC and Ministry, through the HEIs.

5. Communication channel

Supervisors should ensure that MASS awardees are aware that they should communicate with the HEC and the Ministry through the supervisor and the HEI's administration.

6. Adherence to Ethical Standards

- (i) Supervisors should ensure that the MASS awardees obtain necessary approvals from ethics committees.
- (ii) Supervisors should promote integrity in research, including proper data management and avoidance of academic malpractice.

7. Work-Life Balance and Well-being

- (i) Supervisors should be aware of the personal and emotional challenges that MASS awardees may face during their research journey and encourage students to maintain a healthy work-life balance.
- (ii) In cases where MASS awardees are struggling with mental health or personal issues, the MASS awardees should be referred to the appropriate support services and HEC and the Ministry be informed accordingly, through the HEIs.



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MAURITIUS – AFRICA SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME 2025 GUIDELINES FOR NOMINATING AGENCIES

Introduction

The Government of the Republic of Mauritius is offering scholarships to deserving students who are resident citizens of member states of the African Union or of African Commonwealth countries for full-time, on-campus **undergraduate** (diploma/degree) and **postgraduate** (MPhil/PhD) programmes tenable in public Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Mauritius.

1. Nomination Process

A Nominating Agency is typically part of the Ministry of Education in the country of the applicant. The Nominating Agency must ensure that the applicants meet ALL eligibility criteria and that ALL applications are complete prior to submission to the Mauritian Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology.

1.1 Call for Applications

Nominating Agencies are kindly requested to disseminate the **Call for the Mauritius-Africa Scholarship Scheme 2025** as extensively as possible and to receive and process applications from candidates. Nominating Agencies shall submit the duly vetted applications for the July/September 2025 intake by the set deadline of **30 April 2025**.

All applications are to be made through the Nominating Agency, along with the necessary supporting documents.

1.2 Nomination Procedure

1.2.1 Nominating Agencies are required to nominate up to fifteen (15) applicants) for further selection at the level of the Ministry. The decision on the distribution of nominees from the undergraduate and/or postgraduate programmes rest on the nominating agencies.

1.2.2 Nominating Agencies should ensure that applicants satisfy all eligibility criteria and that the application paperwork is complete.

1.2.3 Nomination of ineligible applicants or with incomplete supporting documents will not be considered by the selection committee in Mauritius. Only the best qualified candidates will be selected.

1.2.4 Originals of documents listed under **Section 6** should be verified for all candidates selected by the Nominating Agencies.

1.2.5 Nominating Agencies should ensure that applicants submit the completed **Mauritius Africa Scholarship Application Forms** with all documents as listed in **Section 6**. *The Nominating Agency is free to set an appropriate deadline to receive application and inform applicants of this deadline.* Nominating Agencies are invited to allow for sufficient time for processing and forwarding the documents of nominated candidates to the Mauritian Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology. The deadline for these documents to reach Mauritius are as per the table below:

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1.3 Deadlines for receipt of nomination lists in Mauritius

1.3.1 The Nominating Agency is kindly requested to email scanned copies of all documents of up to **FIFTEEN (15)** eligible candidates to studymauritius@govmu.org at latest by **23 April 2025** for the July/September 2025 intake and then dispatch/courier the complete paper applications directly to:

Applications will only be considered complete upon submission of a hard copies, which should be submitted by **30 April 2025**.

1.3.2 Nominating Agencies should take necessary measures to ensure that all the application forms and hard copies of supporting documents reach the Ministry of education by the set deadlines. Originals of educational qualifications should **NOT** be sent by post but have to be produced by the successful candidates on arrival in Mauritius.

1.3.3 The Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology will **NOT** accept nominations that are received **after set deadlines**.

1.4 Application Enquiries

Nominating Agencies are invited to assist applicants who may contact them to obtain details on the application procedure.

2. Application Procedure

2.1 The Application Form

2.2 Application to the Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)

2.2.1 All applicants must have applied for at least one full-time on-campus programme at a public HEI of their choice (listed under **Section 7**). This application must be made as soon as the HEIs open their application windows on their respective websites.

2.2.2 An application may either be accompanied by:

(a) a *conditional offer (letter of admission)* from the applicant's chosen Mauritian public HEI;
OR

(b) an *acknowledgement notice* from a Mauritian public HEI that the application for a seat has been made and the appropriate application fee has been paid.

2.2.3 Additionally, an application for postgraduate programme must be accompanied by an abridged research plan and, for MPhil/PhD, the name of the proposed supervisor(s) in Mauritius.

2.2.4 ALL candidates must submit the fully completed **Application Form** and documents listed under **Section 6** as part of their application to their local Nominating Agency.

Note:

- 1) Non-submission of the documents as mentioned above, or incorrect or incomplete filling of the application form will result in disqualification of the applicant.



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- 2) The Declaration in **Section 4** of the Application Form must be signed by the applicant.
- 3) Certified copies of academic certificates and transcripts, if not in French or in English, must be submitted along with a certified translation in either one of these two languages.
- 4) Applicants should indicate in **Section 3** of the Application Form the title of up to three (3) courses along with their course codes or proposed research, to which they have been admitted or for which they have submitted an application.

3. Eligibility Criteria of Candidates

3.1 Nationality

Candidates must be resident citizens of your country.

3.2 Age Limit

3.2.1 For undergraduate programmes, applicants should be above 18 years of age and should not have reached their 26th birthday by 01 January 2026.

3.2.2 For MPhil/PhD programmes, applicants should not have reached 40 years 01 January 2026.

3.3 Required Qualifications

3.3.1 Qualification requirements to be eligible for Diploma Programme

Candidates must have:

Either

(i). A minimum of five (5) credits at School Certificate (S.C), or General Certificate of Education (G.C.E) 'O' Level or International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), inclusive of a credit in English Language or acceptable evidence of proficiency in English Language (as per note (d) below).

Or (ii). Five (5) 'O' Level passes awarded by any other approved examining body deemed to be equivalent to (i) above, inclusive of a pass in English Language or acceptable evidence of proficiency in English Language (as per note (d) below).

Or

(iii) Qualification equivalent to (i)

Note:

(a) A pass in English at A level will be acceptable in lieu of English Language at 'O' Level.

(b) A pass at subsidiary level and/or 'A' Level or equivalent will be acceptable in lieu of a pass at 'O' Level as per (i) and (ii) above.

(c) Some diploma programmes may have higher qualification requirements than (i) and (ii) and applications will be considered only for candidates meeting the minimum requirements of these programmes.

(d) In case the language of instruction for the qualifying examination is not English, the candidate will have to provide a valid TOEFL test result with a minimum score of 550 (paper based) or 213 (computer based) or 79 (internet based) or IELTS with a minimum score of 5.5 or an acceptable proof of English Language proficiency.



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3.3.2 Qualification requirements to be eligible for Undergraduate degree Programme

Candidates should have successfully completed end-of-secondary schooling and should satisfy the minimum grade requirements as indicated below:

- (i) at least 21 points at GCE A-Level which will be computed on the basis of the following grades obtained in three Principal subjects: A+=10, A=9, B=8, C=7 & D=6;
OR
- (ii) at least an overall average of 60% or an overall average of 12/20; **OR**
- (iii) qualification equivalent to (i) or (ii) above.

Note:

1. Candidates already holding an undergraduate degree will not be considered
2. In case the language of instruction for the qualifying examination is not English, the candidate will have to provide a valid TOEFL test result with a minimum score of 550 (paper based) or 213 (computer based) or 79 (internet based) or valid IELTS with a minimum score of 5.5 or an acceptable proof of English Language proficiency.

3.3.3 Qualification requirements to be eligible for Postgraduate Programmes

3.3.3.1 For-PhD programme: direct entry will be allowed to the Higher Education Institution provided the applicants meet the requirement of the Higher Education Institution as per **section 1.6** of the Guidelines for Applicants.

3.3.3.2 For MPhil or MPhil / PhD programme: A recognised undergraduate degree with at least an **upper second class** degree (or CPA / GPA greater than 60%) and preferably with a masters' degree and meeting the requirement of the Higher Education Institution as per **section 1.6** of the Guidelines for Applicants

The onus to provide an equivalence of qualifications rests upon the applicants.

Note:

- i. Candidates should submit their abridged research plan along with their application.
- ii. Candidates applying for doctoral studies must provide the name and written acceptance of their proposed supervisor(s). PhD applicants are requested to contact potential supervisors on the link/emails provided at **section 8.3**.

3.3.3 Self-financing African students already studying in Mauritius are **NOT** eligible to apply for the same programme level where they are currently studying under this Scholarship Scheme.

3.4 Nominations by the Agency shall not be made for:

- Top-up degree programmes;
- Foundation programmes;
- Part-time courses;
- Distance Education programmes; or
- Mixed/blended modes (distance and on-campus learning).

4. Shortlisting by the Nominating Agency and Evaluation Process.



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4.1 After receiving applications, Nominating Agencies may:

- 1 select and nominate up to **fifteen (15)** candidates. The decision on the distribution of nominees from the undergraduate and/or postgraduate programmes rest on the nominating agencies
- 2 endorse them on the National Endorsement Form; and
- 3 subsequently transmit the application forms and National Endorsement Form to the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology of Mauritius.

4.2 To be eligible for the Scholarship, your candidates should have your endorsement on both the Application Form and on the National Endorsement Form.

4.3 Selection of candidates for the Scholarship

1. Selection of candidates for the Scholarship will be based on merit;
2. The list of successful applicants for each Member State will be communicated to their respective Nominating Agencies and a communiqué will be placed on the Mauritian Ministry of Education's website once the selection process has been completed; and
3. The Ministry of Education in Mauritius will, thereafter, issue the successful applicants with a scholarship Agreement Form which is to be signed and submitted to the Mauritian Ministry of Education, upon appointment, **within two (2) weeks** of their arrival in Mauritius.

4.4 The Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology of Mauritius reserves the right to cancel or suspend this Call or not to offer scholarship(s) as a result of this Call for Applications.

4.5 Nominating Agencies are kindly requested to advise applicants that they have been nominated for a scholarship as soon as they have been officially so informed by the Government of Mauritius. For this purpose, Nominating Agencies must clearly indicate their contact details (including email address) on the completed **National Endorsement Form**.

5.1.4 The costs incurred for any examination re-sit or repeat of any academic year will be borne by the student.

5.1.5 The scholarship will be for a maximum duration as indicated in the table below or the minimum course duration **whichever is lesser**.

5.1.7 Any costs pertaining to fieldwork overseas or the purchase of books, etc will have to be borne by the student.

5.2 Living allowance

5.2.1 Awardees are expected to come to Mauritius with sufficient funds (approximately USD 1000) to meet expenses during the initial phase of their stay (about three (3) months), while formalities are being completed locally.

5.2.2 A monthly living allowance of **MUR 16,500** will be paid to awardees as part support to meet their living expenses. Students are expected to supplement this amount to cover the cost of living in Mauritius. This allowance will be credited to the awardee's bank account in Mauritius on a monthly basis, subject to the submission of evidence of enrolment and satisfactory attendance in the study programme by the HEI.

5.2.3 The payment of allowances during the final year of enrolment in the study programme will cover, on a pro-rata basis, a period of two (2) weeks following the final day of examinations.

5.2.4 Awardees should inform the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology in writing, preferably **two (2) weeks in advance**, in case they have to leave Mauritius for any reason.

5.2.5 Awardees who have to go abroad during the period of scholarship for data collection will receive their full monthly living allowance while outside Mauritius. This would be subject to a typical maximum duration of **four to six months**, which may be over 2 periods during the whole study period, subject to formal approval of the supervisor and the institution.

All costs associated with such activity (including airfare) shall have to be borne by the student.

The awardee should inform the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology and the Higher Education Commission, through the institution, of the travelling period **two months in advance**.

Note: Project supervisor(s) should give their consent in writing when any MASS awardee student is going for conferences / workshops / seminars etc both locally and abroad at least two (2) months in advance.



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5.3 Other Conditions

5.3.1 The awardees should:

- i. abide by latest government regulations regarding public health
- ii. abide to the protocols setup by Mauritian authorities for passengers travelling to Mauritius;
- iii. be available to commence their academic studies in Mauritius by the start of the academic year of the respective institution in which they have been admitted;
- iv. not be in receipt of or not have received a scholarship from any other public source in Mauritius (including from Higher Education Commission, Mauritius Research and Innovation Council, Higher Education Institutions, etc.); and
- v. undergo a medical check-up as per the Passport and Immigration Office requirements (<http://passport.govmu.org>), in any of the public hospitals in Mauritius and the tests results shall be submitted to the Passport and Immigration Office, with a copy to the Ministry, not later than one month after arrival in Mauritius.

Note: The Ministry reserves the right to request an applicant to undergo any such other medical tests as it deems fit.

- Completed Application Form;
- Certified copy of Birth Certificate;
- Certified copy of bio-data page of passport, if available;
- Certified copies of educational certificates;
- Certified copies of transcripts;
- Medical certificate duly filled-in and signed by a registered medical Practitioner in **Section 6** of the Application Form. This should be appropriately stamped or sealed;
- Copy of letter of conditional offer by a public Higher education institution in Mauritius (if available at time of application) **OR** copy of acknowledgement notice from the Mauritian public HEI that an application for a seat has been made and the appropriate application fee has been paid; and
- Abridged Research plan for candidates opting for a doctoral study.
- Supporting statement from a named supervisor from a University in Mauritius for PhD candidates.

Guidelines for Mauritius Africa Scholarship Scheme awardees travelling abroad during the Scholarship period

1. Travel Guidelines and Requirements

The scholarship covers a return airfare by the most economical route from the country of origin at the beginning of the studies and back to the country of origin upon successful completion. The scholarship does not provide for other travelling expenses during the study period. No request for additional grants will be considered.

Awardees should inform the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology and the Higher Education Commission (HEC) in writing through their respective project supervisor(s) at least **two (2) weeks in advance** if they have to leave Mauritius for any reason.

For data collection, they will have to inform the Ministry, HEC and their Doctoral School/ Faculty through their supervisor(s) at least **two (2) months in advance**.

For attendance to conferences/seminars, awardees would be granted special leave from their institution one day prior to one day after the conference/seminar. They will have to inform the Ministry, HEC and their Doctoral School/ Faculty through their supervisor(s) at least **two (2) months in advance**.

2. Travelling during semester/ end-of-year break

The student will not be entitled to a refund of any expenses related to their travel during semester/ end-of-year break.

3. Travelling outside semester break

MASS awardees are encouraged not to travel during semester time as this may affect their academic progress. Except in cases of emergency travelling (defined in para. 4 below) or for approved institutional special leave, monthly living allowance will be computed pro-rata based on the number of days spent in Mauritius.

4. Emergency Travelling

Students who have to travel urgently to their home country to attend to family matters of high importance or due to illness will continue to benefit from the monthly allowance provided the period of stay abroad is less than 6 weeks.

5. Travelling for data collection purposes

Awardees who have to go abroad during the period of scholarship for data collection will receive their full monthly living allowance while outside Mauritius. This would be subject to a typical maximum duration of **four to six months**, which may be over 2 periods during the whole study period, subject to formal approval of the supervisor and the institution.

All costs associated with such activity (including airfare) shall have to be borne by the student. The awardee should inform the Ministry of Education, Tertiary Education, Science and Technology and the Higher Education Commission, through the institution, of the travelling period **two months in advance**.

6. Travelling to attend Seminars and Conferences

MPhil/PhD awardees may apply to attend and present papers in seminars and conferences abroad as part of their study. Any MASS awardee travelling abroad to attend conferences/ workshops/ colloquium/ symposium must inform the HEC and the Ministry through their supervisor at least eight (8) weeks prior to the event.

The student will bear all cost pertaining to attendance of the event.

The monthly living allowance will be maintained for one day prior to one day after the conference/ seminar and will not be paid beyond the authorised leave period.
